Supreme Court Ruling Limits Power of Federal Agencies: UC Law SF Experts Available to Discuss

The U.S. Supreme Court has overturned a 40-year-old precedent known as Chevron deference that empowers federal agencies to interpret ambiguous laws. The decisions in *Loper Bright Enterprises v. Raimondo* and *Relentless, Inc. v. Dept. of Commerce* follows two SCOTUS decisions on Thursday that undercut the power of federal agencies.

UC Law San Francisco experts can explain how this will affect the power of federal agencies, such as the Environmental Protection Agency, to regulate private companies.
