Reconceptualizing Exclusionary Discipline as an Early Adverse Childhood Event as a Health Justice Imperative

Award: \$10,000 (remainder of event cost paid by another funder)

This half-day convening focuses on the research, structural interventions, and policy reform specific to exclusionary school discipline and its effect on health. The conference will feature researchers, public health practitioners, clinicians, attorneys, and community advocates whose research agendas and practice examine exclusionary school discipline's implications for health equity. A central goal for conference is to advance an interdisciplinary research and policy agenda to diminish disparate exposure to exclusionary school discipline and promote positive childhood health and wellbeing.

Patients, Providers, Pills, and Personhood Post-Dobbs

Award: \$15,000 (remainder of event cost paid by another funder)

This day-long conference brings together national experts from multiple disciplines on reproductive health care and health justice and will explore the ongoing impacts of the *Dobbs* decision.

Survival, Healing, and Performance: Formerly Incarcerated Voices on Health Justice Inside & Out

Award: \$15,000

This 2-hour event will bring together theater performers who have lived through incarceration. They will share their personal encounters with the justice and healthcare systems, delving into their experiences both behind bars and upon reentering society. Following these powerful performances, we will delve deeper into the intersections of the justice system, healthcare, and structural racism through a panel discussion and audience Q+A featuring the performers themselves, alongside UCSF researchers and a former public defender.
